Food Shopping Solutions

- 1. Plan meals for one week at a time.
- 2. Make a list of all the items you need to buy.
- 3. Don't shop when you are hungry.
- 4. When you receive income, set aside enough money to feed your family until the next payday.
- 5. Try to shop alone.
 Find a neighbor who
 also has children. Take turns watching each other's
 kids so you can shop alone.
- 6. Check what supplies you have at home.
- 7. Bring your shopping list with you to the store.
- 8. Go to the food pantry for help and plan your meals around the items you are given.
- 9. Make a shopping list and stick to it.
- 10.Don't buy sodas and snack foods. Eat healthy foods. They are often less expensive.
